Lewis uses the story of "Herbie" to illustrate how the Constraint Innovation fundamentals are leveraged to achieve a mutually beneficial outcome.

Australian born, Israel resident, Lewis is an industrial engineer (MBA, MSc), with over 25 years of experience in applying Theory of Constraints (TOC) within the Israeli military's maintenance; engineering and logistics systems, within government and private industry.
